An Octogenarian's Death.- The death occurred on Friday week at 22 Barton-road, where she had resided for 36 years, of Mrs. Harriet Elizabeth Peach, aged 84, widow of Mr. W. E. Peach. The deceased lady fractured her leg in a fall in her house when she was 80, but made a wonderful recovery. She was an enthusiastic worker for the former Primitive Methodist Church in Pyle-street and had brought up a family of 11 children, seven of whom survive. Her husband died eight years ago and she was buried in his grave at Newport Cemetery on Tuesday, following a service in Quay-street Methodist Church, which was attended by many friends. The Rev H. W. Hamon officiated and Mr. W. G. Bartlett (organist) accompanied the hymns "Just as I am" and "Lord, it belongs not to my care," and played "But the Lord is mindful" and "O rest in the Lord." The chief mourners were Messrs. F. G. and W. E. Peach (sons), Mesdames H. Green and R. James and Miss D. Peach (daughters), Mrs. G. Stagg (grand-daughter), Messrs. H. Furmage and S. A. Porter (sons-in-law), Mesdames F. G. and H. Peach (daughters-in-law), Messrs. P. and F. Green and C. White (nephews), and Mesdames Cooper and Bartlem. - The family express their deep appreciation of the kindness of Dr. S.
