RICHARDS. - Dec. 13, at 123, St. James's-street, Newport, Caroline Ann, widow of the late Rev. Russell Richards, vicar of Wooton Courtney, Somersetshire, aged 83.

DEATH OF MRS. RUSSELL RICHARDS. – We regret to have to record the death of Mrs. Russell Richards, a venerable and philanthropic lady, who had been for many years an esteemed resident of Newport. The funeral took place on Thursday, the first part of the service being performed at St. Thomas's Church, to which the deceased lady had made many valuable gifts, including the very handsome lectern. The choir attended and sang the burial psalm and also the hymn, "Brief life is here our portion." As the body was being borne from the church Mr. Scadding, presiding at the organ, played "I know that my Redeemer liveth." Amongst those who attended the service were the girls of the Blue School, of which excellent institution the late Mrs. Russell Richards was a generous friend. The Vicar and the Rev. R. R. Farrant were the officiating clergy.
