DOUBLE SALVATION ARMY FUNERAL. – Much sympathetic interest was aroused on Thursday by the double Salvation Army funeral. During the week three members of the local Corps have passed away, Bro. Cooke, of New-village, aged 73, Bro. Henry Watson, of Orchard-street, aged 73, and Mrs. Brading of New-street, aged 62. The two last named were those laid to rest on Thursday. Mrs. Brading was one of the oldest Salvationists in Newport, and for many years was the principal *War Cry* seller. In the procession the male and female soldiers wore white armllets and sashes respectively. The band played “Promoted to Glory” from the Barracks to Carisbrooke Cemetery, where Adj. Cox read the Burial Service. A memorial service will be held to-morrow (Sunday).
