Death of Mrs. E. E. Adams.----The death occurred at her home, 17 Melbourne Street, on Monday, of Mrs. Ellen Elizabeth Adams, after an illness lasting three years, aged 84. She was the widow of Mr. Frank Henry Adams, who died in 1921. She married Mr. Adams, a master butcher, in 1918. Mrs. Adams was an original member of the Darby and Joan Club, and continued her membership up to the time of her illness. She was also one of the oldest members of the St. John's Mothers' Meeting. As a member of the Women's Voluntary Service, she served in the canteen at the Legh Richmond Hall during the last war. Mrs. Adams was also a member of the British Legion, and was a collector on Poppy Days. She was a keen gardener. She is survived by a daughter, nine grandchildren, and 21 great-grandchildren. The funeral took place on Thursday. A service at the Carisbrooke Cemetery Chapel was conducted by the Rev. W. R. Stokes, followed by interment in the cemetery. The family mourners were Messrs. G., D., and K. Newton and J. Cornish (grandsons). Among the floral tributes was one from the Darby and Joan Club, the British Legion, the St. John's Mothers' Meeting, and neighbours and friends of Clarendon and Melbourne Streets. The arrangements were made by Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son.
