Death of Mr. F. N. Armstrong. – The death took place at the Royal I.W. County Hospital, on Tuesday, of Mr. Francis Napoleon Armstrong, of Lochiel, Castle Hill. Mr. Armstrong, born in Southampton in 1888 and educated at Taunton School, Southampton, served in the first world war as a lieutenant in the Tank Corps, in which he was one of the pioneers and among the first instructors. He came to the Island 17 years ago as manager for Radio Rentals, when that firm started here, and built up a service in all parts of the Island. He remained at work until less than a year ago, when he retired owing to ill-health. He leaves a widow, a daughter, and two grandsons. The flag of the Newport Conservative Club, of which he was a member, was flown at half mast. The funeral service takes place to-day (Saturday) at St. Mary's Church, at 2 p.m.
