The Late Miss Alice Bailey.---The funeral took place on Wednesday of Miss Alice Bailey, of 5 St. John's Place, whose death after a long illness occurred at St. Mary's Hospital on Saturday. Miss Bailey was the only surviving daughter of the late Mr. W. J. Bailey, who was connected with the firm of Messrs. Bailey, solicitors. She was particularly well known in connection with the Quay Street Methodist Church, where she was a member of the choir and deputy organist to her elder brother, the late Mr. W. J. Bailey, who was organist for many years. Miss Bailey also occasionally played the organ at the P.T.E. meetings. In her earlier days she interested herself in the local branch of the St. John Ambulance Brigade, and received a medallion for her services. She was the devoted companion to her brother (Mr. H. Bailey), with whom she had lived and with whom much sympathy is felt. The service was held at the Quay Street Methodist Church, the Rev. A. H. Clarke officiating. Mr. W. G. Cooper, at the organ, accompanied the deceased's favourite hymn, "Jesu, Lover of my soul." The mourners were Mr. H. Bailey (brother) and the Misses Florence Bailey and D. A. Newnham (nieces). Others present were Mesdames A. Odell, W. G. Cooper, A. Cushen, J. Smith, and A. Chiverton, the Misses A. Baker and F. E. M. Scott, and Messrs. W. Goulden and W. Matthews. The interment was at Carisbrooke Cemetery. Messrs. H. and F. Damp made the arrangements.
