Death of Mrs. C. D. Blee.- The funeral took place at St. John's Church on Monday, conducted by the Vicar (Rev. S. F. Cooper), of Mrs. Queenie Blee, wife of Major C. D. Blee, of Harveymeade, 14 College Road, whose death at the age of 57 occurred the previous Thursday in the Royal I.W. County Hospital, after a long illness. Mrs. Blee, who was born in the borough, was the elder child of the late Mr. and Mrs. A. G. Lockhart, and before her marriage was confectioner at Messrs. Harveys. She spent a good deal of her life abroad with her husband on Army service, particularly in China and Germany. In 1956, on her husband's retirement, she returned to live in Newport, but her last seven months were spent in the County Hospital. At the funeral the hymns "Jesu, Lover of my soul" and "The day Thou gavest" were sung. The family mourners were Major C. D. Blee (husband), Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Lockhart (brother and sister-in-law), Miss P. Lockhart (sister), Mr. and Mrs. F. Buckett and Mr. and Mrs. W. R. Turner (brothers-in-law and sisters), Mr. and Mrs. E. Blee, Mr. and Mrs. W. Blee, Major and Mrs. J. Blee, Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Blee and Miss M. Blee (brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law), Mr. G. W. Blee (father-in-law), Mr. S. Lockhart (nephew), and Mr. S. Cheesman. Mr. R. J. Lockhart (brother) and Mr. H. Blee (brother-in-law) were prevented from attending. Interment was at Carisbrooke Cemetery. Messrs. H. and F. Damp made the arrangements - Major Blee thanks doctors, matron, and nurses at the County Hospital for their devoted care, and all who sent messages of sympathy and flowers.
