NEWPORT

DEATH OF AN OLD INHABITANT. - On Monday afternoon the mortal remains of an old and respected townsman, Mr. Geore Cantelo, were laid to rest in the parish Cemetery. The deceased gentleman, who during his long sojourn here had made many friends and no enemies, passed quietly away at the residence of his son-in-law, Mr. Robert Roche, on the 24th ult., at the ripe old age of 86. The family of the late Mr. Cantelo settled in the Island some two centuries ago. For some 40 years the deceased gentleman, in partnership with his brother, carried on the ironmongery business in St. Thomas's-square, of which Mr. W. H. Upton is now proprietor, and on the death of his brother he retired in favour of his nephews. It may be interesting to mention that under the direction of Baron Marochetti the late Mr. Cantelo constructed the iron railing around the tomb of Princess Elizabeth in St. Thomas's Church. The funeral took place on Monday afternoon, the Vicar (Rev. Clement Smith) officiating. The chief mourners were Mr. Robert Roche, Mr. Edgar Cantelo Roche (grandson), and Mr. William Bright, sen. There were also present Messrs. T. Self, F. Shepard, Cornelius Salter, and H. Harvey, the two last named representing the Hand-in-Hand Friendly Society, with which deceased had been connected since 1829.
