Devoted Church Worker's Death.- Miss Annie Cave, for many years a devoted worker for the Quay-street Methodist, died on Thursday week and was buried on Monday. She was a companion to Miss Downer, of 19 Hunnyhill. For about 30 years she was a Sunday-school teacher, a worker in the Christian Endeavour and temperance movements, particularly in connection with the Good Templars, and the Band of Hope Union, of which she was the Island treasurer. In all her works she was faithful, generous, kindly and cheery. The funeral was conducted by the Rev. H. W. Hamon at the Quay-street Methodist Church and at Carisbrooke Cemetery. The mourners were Mr. F. Cave (brother), Mesdames Tharle, Flood, Bull and White (nieces), Mr. Flood, Miss Downer, Mrs. A. and Miss Carpenter, Mrs. King, Mrs. Leal, Mr. and Mrs. W. and Mr. L. Downer (president of the I.W. Band of Hope Union). There were wreaths from the organisations with which the deceased was associated.
