DEATH OF MR. HARRY CHAPPELL. - Newport has lost a promising young townsman by the death of Mr. Harry Chappell, which took place early yesterday (Friday) morning from complications following influenza. The deceased, who was in the very flower of his young manhood, was an active member of the Newport Rowing Club, of which he was for some time the zealous and energetic hon. secretary. He was also secretary of the Volunteer Fire Brigade, and his loss in connection with that organisation will be greatly felt, as it will also be by all the societies with which he was connected. His death is deeply deplored by all who knew him, and their sincere sympathy is with the widowed mother and the other members of the bereaved family in their sorrow. The funeral will take place on Tuesday.

FUNERAL OF MR. HARRY CHAPPELL. – The funeral of this respected and lamented young townsman took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Tuesday afternoon. Flags on the vessels lying at the Quay were flying at half-mast, as was also the flag on the ground of the Newport Football Club, of which deceased was formerly a member. The first part of the service took place at the parish church, the Vicar (the Rev. Clement Smith) officiating. The mourners included Messrs. Arthur and Percy Chappell (brothers), Messrs. Frank, Harry, William, and Percy Shepard (cousins), Messrs. J. E. Milligan, W. T. James, and E. H. Tame, and the employees of Messrs. Shepard Bros., with which firm deceased was connected. The Rowing Club, of which deceased was captain, was represented by Messrs. John Roach (president), T. R. Tilling, C. Webb, and W. L. Bright. At the church the cortege was joined by the Mayor (chairman of the Volunteer Fire Brigade, of which deceased was secretary), Messrs. J. George, J.P., F. Dallimore, and a number of members of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows, of which deceased was a member. ... The Oddfellows' burial service was read at the grave by Bro. T. H. Walden, L.M. The numerous floral tributes included wreaths bearing the following inscriptions:- "From the employees of the firm of Messrs. Shepard Bros., with deep regret," and "With the deepest sympathy of the members of the Newport Rowing Club to their late captain."
