DEATH OF MR. C. M. CHIVERTON. ---We regret to record the death, which took place on Wednesday after a lengthy illness, of Mr. Charles Mew Chiverton, aged 68, of 16 West-end-terrace, a former well-known tradesman of the town, who for some 23 years carried on the grocery and licensed business at the Bedford, The Mall. Before trading on his own account the late Mr. Chiverton was in the employ of Messrs. Dyer and Godfrey, of Newport. The deceased gentleman, who was esteemed in business and private life and had discharged the duties of overseer, retired from business about 12 years ago, chiefly owing to failing health. Deceased was one of the oldest members of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows. He was formerly a member of the Newport Fanciers` Association and a successful exhibitor at poultry shows, and he was a well-known breeder of pug dogs years ago. Much sympathy is felt for the widow and sons and daughter of deceased in their bereavement. The funeral will take place on Monday afternoon at Carisbrooke Cemetery, leaving the residence at 2 o'clock.
