Death of Mrs. Croton.—Newport has lost an old and well known resident by the death, at the age of 72, of Mrs. Rosa Fanny Croton, wife of Mr. J. Croton and second daughter of the late Mr. J. Griffiths, of Shanklin. Mrs. Croton had many friends in the Hunny-hill district, where she had resided for some years. The deceased lady had given great assistance to many organisations as a collector, notably the County Hospital, of which she was appointed a life governor in recognition of her services.

She was a member of the Victoria Methodist Church and of the Sisterhood, Women's work, and Society Class. Her activities also included membership of the International Order of Good Templars. Her death occurred at the residence of her elder son, 10 Nelson-road.

The funeral service took place in the Victoria Methodist School on Thursday week in the presence of a large congregation, the Rev. H. Jackson officiating. The mourners were Messrs. V. and O. Croton (sons), Master I. Croton (grandson), Mesdames Batts and Phillips (sisters), and Mesdames V. and O. Croton (daughters-in-law).

The interment was in the Carisbrooke Cemetery, there being many choice wreaths. Mr. Wells made the arrangements.
