FORESTER'S FUNERAL. – The funeral of Mr. James Cushen, aged 49, who died rather suddenly on Saturday from syncope, following a rather long illness, took place on Wednesday at Carisbrooke Cemetery. The deceased had been employed in the cooper's shed at the Royal Brewery for some 30 years. He was a member of the local Court of Foresters. He was also an enthusiastic bowler, having been for some time deputy-captain of the Carisbrooke Bowling Club and had won several trophies on the well-known green at the Eight Bells. In addition to the chief mourners there were present Bros. F. Spanner (secretary), who read the Foresters' service at the graveside, and C. Eldridge (trustee), of the local Court of Foresters. Messrs. A. Pointer, J. Dellar, J. Sheaf, W. Cheeseman (bearers), G. Gifford, G. H. Chiverton, J. Bond, and T. Pettet represented the Royal Brewery. The members of the Carisbrooke Bowling Club present included Messrs. N. H. T. Mursell (captain), W. Saunders, W. Blake, and A. Newbery. There were several beautiful floral tributes, including an artificial one from the employees of Messrs. W. B. Mew, Langton, and Co., and from members of the Carisbrooke Bowling Club. The Rev. I. Rees officiated and Mr. H. Parnell carried out the funeral arrangements.
