THE LATE MRS. F. DAMP

The funeral of Mrs. Lelié Caroline Damp, of Holly Bank, Medina-avenue, widow of Mr. Frank Damp, builder and an ex-mayor of the borough, who died in 1936, took place on Saturday, a service being held at the Castlehold Baptist Church, and the interment at Carisbrooke Cemetery. Mrs. Damp was a daughter of the late Mr. Charles Colenutt, grocer, of Lower St. James's-street. Although she had been an invalid for many years, she fully shared her late husband's devoted interest in the Baptist Church, and the Pastor (the Rev. E. G. Keed), who officiated, spoke of her constant support of the church and of her life of singular sweetness, nobly lived. Mrs. W. R. Pilcher (organist) accompanied the singing of the hymn "Abide with me".
