**OBITUARY.** - The death occurred at 34 Clifford-street on Saturday of an esteemed and well-known townsman in the person of Mr. Edward William George Daniels, who will be remembered as a signalman at the Newport Railway-station, a position he held for 26 years. He was 72 years of age and had been ailing for some time. Mr. Daniels was a valued and helpful member of the St. John's Men's Bible Class, and formerly assisted Mr. Barton in the work at the Barton-village Mission-room. At the meeting of the St. John's Men's Bible Class on Sunday the Leader (Mr. James Eldridge) referred to the loss the class had sustained in the death of Mr. Daniels, who had always been most ready to assist them in any way. A vote of condolence was passed with the widow and family. The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Wednesday, the Rev. A. C. Stratton (vicar of St. John's) officiating. Messrs. J. Dewey and J. Baker represented the St. John's Men's Bible Class.
