**The Late Mr. A. L. Dore.**- Mr. Arthur Lewis Dore, of Aldgar, 35 College Road, died at his home on Thursday, aged 58. He was well known in the town, of which he was a native, as a craftsman of outstanding ability. He was trained as plumber and hot water fitter by the late Mr. E. W. Tyler, and in 1943 he became civilian plumber at Parkhurst Prison. He served in France in the 1914-18 war with Major (later Lt. Col. ) D. G. Brodie's 221st R.E. Coy. and was wounded. He had been in failing health since Christmas. He leaves a widow. The funeral will be at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Monday at 2 p.m.

**Colleagues Act as Bearers** - The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Monday, the Rev. Dr. W. H. Mildon officiating, of Mr. Arthur Lewis Dore, of Aldgar, 35 College Road, who died at his home on Thursday week, aged 58. Mr. Dore had the reputation of being a craftsman of outstanding ability and for 11 years had been plumber and hot water fitter at Parkhurst Prison. Colleagues acted as bearers. Dore (mother), Mr. and Mrs. J. Churcher, Mrs. W. Russell and Mr. S. Russell (brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law), Mr. A. Russell (uncle). Mr. and Mrs. B. J. Dore (Bournemouth), and Mrs. H. B. Rayner were unavoidably prevented from attending. Floral tributes included one from the Governor and Works Staff of Parkhurst Prison. Messrs. A. A. and R. J. Westmore made the arrangements - Mrs. A. L. Dore and family thank Dr G. L. Peskett, Mrs. Cronon, and neighbours for devoted attention, and friends for kind inquiries, messages of sympathy, and floral tributes.
