Death of Mr. R. G. Downer.- The death occurred at his residence, 34 Medina-avenue, on Thursday, of Mr. Reginald George Downer. Mr. Downer, who was 40 years of age, was a native of Swainston, where his father, Mr. R. H. Downer, of Crinages, Chale, a well known lay Methodist preacher, was an employee for over 40 years. After serving in the Great War the deceased was employed for some years by Messrs. H. W. Morey & Son, in charge of lorries. Later he joined the staff of the Refuge Insurance Co., for whom he worked for five years. Unfortunately, in 1936, he suffered the loss of a leg, and since that time has been employed as a clerk by Messrs. John Sheath and Co. at their Nodehill premises. He had been ailing for some considerable time. In spite of his physical handicap and increasing ill-health, Mr. Downer displayed a courageous cheerfulness that won the admiration of all. He was a keen playing member of the indoor and outdoor bowling clubs and a popular member of the Newport and Carisbrooke branch of the British Legion. Sincere sympathy is felt with his widow and two children. The funeral will take place today (Saturday); service at the Methodist Church, Pyle-street, at 2.30 p.m.

Downer. - The funeral of Mr. Reginald George Downer, of 34 Medinaavenue, whose death at the early age of 40 is greatly regretted, took place at the Pyle-street Methodist Church on Saturday, conducted by the Rev.
