Death of Mr. W. J. Fallick.—The funeral took place on Thursday week, of Mr. William James Fallick, aged 80, of 2 East View, Trafalgar Road, whose death occurred at St. Mary's Hospital the previous Sunday. Mr. Fallick was a native of the town and for over 40 years he worked as a baker for Messrs. G. C. Russell. His long service with the firm was recognised by a directorship and he retired 16 years ago. His wide range of activities included many years with the former town fire brigade and membership of the I.W. Fanciers' Club. A keen sportsman, he played for the Parkhurst Thursday Football Club and was in the side which won the Thursday League in the 1903-4 season. He was a member of Newport F.C.
