THE FUNERAL – of Principle Warder George Fisher, of H.M. Convict Prison, took place on Saturday last, when the whole of the staff who could be spared followed the deceased to the grave at Carisbrooke cemetery. The arrangements were under the direction of Chief Warder Allison, and four principal warders acted as pall-bearers. Amongst many friends present were a deputation representing the Isle of Wight District Orange Lodge, the deceased having been one of the first members of the mother lodge of the Island. The deputation included Bro. J. H. Warsap, D.M., J. Hardy, P.N., J. Dougherty, P.M., J. Chapman, treas., the D.D.M., and D.S., and Bro. Daymond, sec. of 555. The deceased, who had been 16 years in the service, and was much respected, leaves a widow (an invalid) and four children.
