DEATH OF MR. HENRY FLUX. - The death occurred on Monday, at his residence, Drillall-road, after a fortnight's illness, of Mr. Henry Flux, a well known and respected Newportonian, at the age of 67. Deceased spent several years of his early business life in Canada, but returned to Newport over 30 years ago and settled down in business as a builder, &c. He was a valued member and one of the original trustees of the United Methodist Church. He also took an active part in the temperance work and was one of the oldest and most ardent members of the local Lodge of Good Templars. Much sympathy is felt with the widow and family in their bereavement. The funeral took place on Thursday afternoon, a large congregation assembling in the United Methodist Church, where a service was held previous to the interment at Carisbrooke Cemetery. The Rev. P. Cudmore officiated. ... Mr. G. Bartlett presided at the organ and played "O rest in the Lord" as the mourners left the building. Amongst those present were Messrs. R. Bullen, J.P., and A. H. North (trustees of the church), W. J. Bailey, jun. (secretary to the trustees), Isaac Salter, J. H. Black, and D. J. Bartlett. The Good Templars were represented by the following: Bros. A. J. Sanders, D.C.T., J. Carpenter, D.S., Chiverton, D. Sent (Bembridge), and Sisters Fox, D.V.T. (Shanklin), McLean, D.Chap. (Ryde), and Sanders, D.S., J.W. (Newport). The Island Centre Lodge, of which deceased was a valued deputy, was represented by Bros. Barrett, C.T., E. A. Daily, P.C.T., T. Sibbick, Sec., and some 15 members. On the coffin rested the deceased's Good Templar's regalia, with the honour of Past Grand Marshal, which office the deceased held whilst in Canada, and the ordinary proceedings at the graveside were supplemented by the Good Templars' service, read by Bros. Sanders and Carpenter and Sis. McLean. There were no flowers by request. The family mourners were Messrs. J. H. Flux, A.R.C.O. (son), W. Flux (brother), F. Turner (brother-in-law), H. Upward (son-in-law), H. G. Groundsell and W. Whitfield (nephews), and W. Upward. Mr. William Flux was the undertaker.
