DEATH OF A BANK CLERK- Much sympathy will be extended to Mrs. Garland, of Forestroad, in the sad loss she has suffered by the death on Wednesday, at the early age of 37, of her husband, Mr. Leonard Keble Garland, a well known and popular member of the local staff of Lloyds Bank. The deceased, who was a Londoner, came to Newport in 1928 for the benefit of his health, which had been seriously affected by war service. He was a private in The Buffs and served in France when only 17, and went from there to Salonica, where he contracted malaria and for a short time received a disability pension. He returned to his duties at the bank and bravely and cheerfully endeavoured to carry on his work. He succeeded for some time, but was eventually granted six months' leave to undergo treatment at the Royal National Hospital, St. Lawrence, and returned apparently cured in February, 1931, and continued working until December last. Then he was again taken ill and was granted further leave. The end came peacefully on Wednesday, to the great regret of many friends. The deceased was a member of Toc H and of the Conservative Club. He leaves a widow and one child. The funeral service will be held at the Parish Church to-day at 1.45 p.m., the interment following at Carisbrooke Cemetery at 2.30.
