Former Builder's Widow.--The funeral took place on Thursday week of Mrs. Margaret May Gulliver, aged 80, widow of Mr. W. S. Gulliver. She died the previous Sunday at her home 128 Medina Avenue. Mrs. Gulliver was born at Carisbrooke and became a teacher at the local infants' school before her marriage to Mr. Gulliver, who was in business as a builder. Until her health failed, nearly seven years ago, she had been a regular worshipper at St. John's Church and a member of the Pyle Street Sisterhood. She also attended St. John's Mothers' Meeting and the Wayfarers' women's meeting at Carisbrooke. The Rev. S. F. Cooper officiated, assisted by the Rev. E. F. K. Dana (rector of Northwood) at a service at St. John's Church. Mr. H. A. Lower was organist and the service included the hymn "The strife is o'er" and the 23rd Psalm. The mourners included the Misses E. and M. Gulliver (daughters), Mr. and Mrs. D. W. Gulliver (son and daughter-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. A. D. Gulliver and Mr. and Mrs. J. Gallop (grandchildren), and Mrs. H. Hillier and Mrs. H. Hayward (also representing Mr. H. Hillier, nephew). Interment was at Carisbrooke Cemetery. Floral tributes included those from the P.S.A., directors and staff of Fred Trim, Ltd., the Cowes Christian Mission and the Wayfarers' Fellowship, Carisbrooke. Mr. A. E. Wyatt made the arrangements.
