SERGT.-INSTRUCTOR'S DEATH AND FUNERAL.

Yesterday (Friday) afternoon the funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery of Mr. James Robert Henry Hall, late colour-sergeant of the Cheshire Regiment, aged 45, who died at Carisbrooke on Monday. The deceased was a native of the Island, having been born at Parkhurst, and until recently he held the appointment of sergeant-instructor of the Stalybridge Volunteers and Territorials. The mourners included Mr. Charles Hall (son), Miss E. Hall (sister), Mrs. Taylor (sister-in-law), and Mr. Taylor (brother-in-law), who travelled from Dorchester to be present. A beautiful wreath on the coffin was inscribed "With our sincere sympathy, from the adjutant and officers of the Cheshire Regiment," and another was inscribed "As a token of respect from the N.C.O.s and men, 6th Battalion of the Cheshire Regiment, Stalybridge detachment, to our late instructor, Col.-Sergt. J. Hall." The Rev. I. Rees, of Carisbrooke, officiated, and Mr. J. H. King, of Blackwater, had charge of the funeral arrangements.
