The Late Mrs. M. D. Hayles.--The death occurred at her home at 30 St. John's Road on Sunday, of Mrs. Mabel Dorothy Hayles aged 71. Mrs. Hayles was a daughter of the late Mr. W. Barton, builder, of Newport, and the sister of the late Mr. Ernest W. Barton. She was born in the borough but in 1936 she left with her husband to reside in Lymington where Mr. Hayles was employed as an assistant inspector of postmen. In 1957 they returned and took up residence in St. John's Road. In her early days Mrs. Hayles was a member of St. John's Church Choir and of the women's section of the British Legion. She was also connected with the Victory Hall in Clarence Road. The funeral took place on Wednesday when a service at St. John's Church was conducted by the Rev. S. F. Cooper. The hymns "Thine for Ever" and the "23rd Psalm" were sung. Mr. W. Faulkner was at the organ. The mourners were Mr. W. Hayles (husband), Mr. and Mrs. J. Earley (son-in-law and daughter), Mr. and Mrs. J. Greening (son-in-law and daughter), Mr. E. Heal (brother-in-law). Mr. and Mrs. H. Biles, Mr. and Mrs. B. Gilbert, Mr. and Mrs. L.
