CARISBROOKE.

Death of Mr. C. H. Heather.— We regret to record the death at his residence, Cissbury, Castle-street, on Saturday, following a short illness, of Mr. Charles Henry Heather, aged 74. A native of Worthing, Mr. Heather came to the Island about 40 years ago, and had resided in the village for the latter half of that period. He was a skilled scenic artist by profession, but of late years had done a great deal of lettering and sign writing, at which he was an expert, and many excellent examples of his work are to be seen in the district. A man of reserved character, Mr. Heather was greatly respected, and sincere sympathy is felt with his only daughter, Miss Hilda Heather, the music mistress at Carisbrooke House School. His wife died 12 years ago. The funeral was on Wednesday, the service in the Parish Church being conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. H. Ewbank). The mourners were Miss H. Heather (daughter), Mrs. Reynolds (sister-in-law), Mrs. Ventress (niece), Mr. R. Taylor (representing Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Dunn), Mr. and Mrs. T. E. W. Phillips, Miss E. Attrill, and Mr. Harrison Webb. Others attending were; Mr. and Mrs. R. W. George, Mrs. W. J. Strickland, Miss H. Ruddle, Mr. R. J. Eldridge, Mr. H. Phillips, and Mr. R. Burt. The interment was at the Cemetery.
