Death of Mr. A. Hogan.- The death occurred peacefully at his home, 29 Cypress Road, on Tuesday, of Mr. Arthur Hogan, I.S.O., M.B.E., aged 81, who had lived here since 1939. Mr. Hogan, who is the father of Mrs. Peskett, wife of Dr. G. L. Peskett, was retired from the Exchequer and Audit Department of H.M. Treasury. Before coming to the Island he lived in Epsom, Surrey. During the 1914-18 war he was in France and Italy in charge of audit of the British Expeditionary Forces. He was a keen philatelist and at one time stamp editor of "Harper's Weekly," but had to give up his own collection when his sight failed. He was a member of the Parthenon Lodge of Freemasons, of Sutton, Surrey, and well known and respected in the Epsom area, where he was treasurer of the local Boy Scout's Association, and did much voluntary audit work for charitable organisations and the church. Mr. Hogan took a great interest in bowls, and was a member and for a short time secretary of the Newport Club. He frequently took long walks to study natural history, and his interest in the subject led him to join the Natural History and Archaeological Society, and serve on its committee. He leaves a widow and four children, with whom much sympathy is felt. The funeral is today at St. John's Church at 2.15 p.m.
