DEATH OF MR. H. JUPE.-The death took place yesterday week at his residence, Glenholme, Carisbrooke-road, at the age of 61, of a respected tradesman and Islander, in the person of Mr. Harry Jupe, who for 23 years had carried on the old-established marine store dealer's business so long identified with the name of Messrs. Johnson, of Upper St. James's-street and Scarrots-lane. Under the strain of business worries associated with tumbling markets during last year, the deceased experienced a serious breakdown in health and nerves about three months ago, from which he never recovered, and in spite of tender nursing and all that medical skill could do he gradually sank and died. Before taking over the marine store dealer's business deceased was a dealer, and prior to that he was farming for some years at Rew-street, Fullholding, and Park. He was an ardent cyclist, and one of the old members of the I.W. Cycling Club. He was also a valued member of the Conservative Club, of the local Court of Foresters, and a former member of the Literary Society. Much sympathy is felt with the widow and other relatives in their bereavement. The funeral took place on Tuesday at Carisbrooke Cemetery, the Vicar of Carisbrooke (the Rev. T. Story Busher) officiating. The mourners included Mr. A. Jupe (son), Mr. B. Jupe (brother), Mr. W. Phipp, Mr. A. Jacobs, Mr. R. Reed, and Mr. W. Urry (brothers-in-law), Messrs. E. Way, J. R. Alderslade, and J. Moorman.
