Death of Mr. Wm. Knott.—We regret to record the death at the Royal I. W. County Hospital, on Thursday morning, after a serious operation, of Mr. Wm. Knott, of the Brewery, Orchard-street, at the age of 66. The deceased gentleman was in his usual health until towards the end of last week when the necessity for the operation became suddenly evident. Mr. Knott was one of our best known and most respected townsmen, although he had abstained from taking part in public work for which his friends regarded him as well fitted. He was a most useful and valued member of the old Hand-in-Hand Friendly Society, on the Standing Committee of which he did good work.

For over 40 years he carried on the well known brewery business, in which he succeeded his father. A strong imperialist and intensely patriotic he was pardonably proud of the fact that one of his sons, by dint of sheer merit, had risen to the rank of Engineer-Commander in the Navy, whilst his other son, Councillor S. J. Knott, holds a commission in the Army. The latter succeeded to the brewery business on his father's retirement some time ago, but the deceased self-sacrificingly returned to its management in order to release his son for military service. The late Mr. Knott possessed marked independence of character, and his loss is greatly mourned by a wide circle of friends, who deeply sympathise with the widow and the other members of the family in their bereavement.
