Death of Mr. J. Lashmar. - The funeral service took place on Monday at St. John's Church of Mr. Jack Lashmar, well known as a clubman and bowler. Mr. Lashmar was chairman of the local Social Club and a vice-president of the I.W. County Bowling Association, the local Billiards and Snooker League, and of the Newport Bowling Club. A skilled wood-working machinist, formerly with Messrs. W. Matthews and Sons, he later worked for Messrs. J. Samuel White and Co., Ltd., and was secretary of the Amalgamated Society of Woodworkers. For the last ten years he had been an agent for the Ryde branch of the Royal London Mutual Insurance Society, Ltd. The Rev. S. F. Cooper officiated and the organist was Mr. J. P. Darch, who was associated with Mr. Lashmar as a brother of the Loyal Order of Moose. The mourners were Mrs. M. Lashmar (widow), Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Lashmar and Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Lashmar (sons and daughters-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. J. Matthews (uncle and aunt), Mrs. V. James (sister-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. C. Frost (brother-in-law and sister-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. J. Balaam (nephew and niece), Mr. C. Matthews, Mrs. M. Reckett, Mrs. J. Fallick and Mr. W. Clarke (cousins), Mr. and Mrs. E. Sheaf and Mr. and Mrs. C. Edmunds (friends), and representatives from various clubs, associations and societies of which he was a member, as well as colleagues from his employers' office at Ryde. Internment was at Carisbrooke Cemetery.
