ACCIDENT VICTIM'S FUNERAL - The funeral took place on Saturday of Geoffrey Edward William Leppard, aged 16, of 133 Gunville Road, one of two youths who died on Whit-Monday as a result of a motor cycle accident at Rolls Hill, Northwood. Geoffrey, who was the son of Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Leppard, was a former pupil of the Priory Secondary Boys' School. On January last year he began an apprenticeship in marine engineering at Messrs. J. Samuel White and Co., Ltd. He was a member of 1st Northwood Sea Scouts group and of the IW. Motor Cycle Club. He was also a member of the Sunday school and Youth Club of the Gunville Methodist Church, where the funeral service was conducted by the Rev. G.L.W. Ridge. Members of the 1st Northwood Sea Scouts group formed a guard of honour as the cortège entered the church. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. Leppard (father and mother), Mr. and Mrs. T. Moon (brother-in-law and sister), Mr. A.J. Leppard (brother), Mr. and Mrs. W. and Messrs. E. and F. Leppard and Mrs. J. Coshell (uncles and aunts), Mrs. A. Sexton and Mr. J. Hallissey.

The large attendance included representatives of the various church organisations, 1st Northwood Sea Scout group and the I.W. Motor Cycle Club. Among the floral tributes were those from the I.W.
