**Death of an Inland Revenue Official.**—The death occurred at the County Hospital, Ryde, on Sunday, following an operation, of Mr. Alexander Logie, of 27 Clarence-road, who was a highly respected official employed in the local office of the Inland Revenue. Mr. Logie, was formerly employed in the Register of Sasines, Edinburgh, which corresponds with the Probate Registry in England, and was a native of that city. He was transferred to Newport on account of ill-health in January, 1928, and had made many friends during his residence here.

He served in Gallipoli and Egypt during the war, and was invalided out of the Army suffering from the effects of a gunshot wound which occasioned much pain, and ultimately necessitated an operation. He had been seriously ill since March 18th, and was removed to the County Hospital on Thursday week.

He leaves a widow. The funeral took place at St. John's Church on Thursday and was conducted by the Rev. H. Ewbank, the interment following at Carisbrooke Cemetery. The mourners were the widow, Mr. and Mrs. E. Chessum, of Luton (brother-in-law and sister), and Mr. and Mrs. E. Saunders of Southsea. Others present at the service were Dr. Heathcote, Mr. H. Bennett, Mr. C. Hickey, and the Misses Wells, Webb, and Cooper.

The officials present were Mr. E. J. Saddler, H.M. Inspector of Taxes, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Williams, Mr. and Mrs. Earl, and Mr. J. F. New (representing the Inland Revenue collecting staff, in the unavoidable absence of Mr. A. B. Cooke, chief collector), and Mr. J. H. R. Williams. Among the floral tributes was a wreath from H.M. Inspector of Taxes and the staff at the Inland Revenue Office.

The funeral arrangements were carried out by Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son.
