MILITARY VETERAN'S FUNERAL. - The funeral took place with military honours at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Monday of Mr. Edward Marshall, a pensioner from the Hants and I.W. Artillery Militia Staff, and a National Reservist, who died suddenly on the previous Thursday, at his workshop in Pyle-street, at the age of 75. The 3rd Royal Warwickshire Regiment supplied the firing party and band, and the coffin, covered by the Union Jack, was borne on a gun-carriage of the Hants R.F.A. Howitzers at Parkhurst. The band played Sumner's "Funeral March," as the cortege left for the cemetery. The family mourners were the widow, Mr. E. E. Marshall (son), Misses F. and Alice Marshall (daughters), Mrs. E. E. Marshall (daughter-in-law), Mrs. F. Cheverton (step-daughter), Mr. George Groves (brother-in-law), Mrs. Niblett (niece), and Mr. F. Cheverton. There were floral tributes from the family and friends, Mrs. James George, Mr. E. Peck, Mrs. Godfrey (Ryde), and others. The Rev. T. Story Busher (vicar of Carisbrooke) officiated, and the customary three volleys and the sounding of the "Last Post" concluded the impressive ceremony. Mr. O. Hamilton was the undertaker.
