**DEATH OF MR. GEORGE PERKINS.** – We regret to record the death on Thursday, at 2 Bedford-cottages, The Mall, of Mr. George Perkins, aged 64, late of the Pan Foundry. The deceased, who had been in failing health for some time, was well known and respected as a millwright and agricultural engineer, first in the firm of Messrs. Perkins and Dunn at Orchard-street and afterwards at Pan Foundry. He was responsible for installing some important milling machinery in the Island, and in all departments of his work he was a very practical, resourceful and reliable engineer. He was for some years responsible for the erection of the shedding, &c., at the Royal I.W. Agricultural Show, and his services have been most valuable in the machinery hall of the *County Press*, particularly in cases of emergency due to accidents. The funeral will take place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Monday at 12.15.

**THE LATE MR. GEORGE PERKINS.** – The funeral of the late Mr. George Perkins, the well-known agricultural and general engineer, late of Pan Foundry, took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Monday, the Rev. J. L. Spratt, M.A. officiating. The family mourners were the widow, Mr. H. Perkins (brother), Mr. and Mrs. Chopping (son-in-law and daughter), the Misses Minnie and Mabel Perkins (daughters), and those also attending were Dr. J. B. McKay and Messrs. Ald. Charles Webb, R. Holt, W. C. Smith, W. and O. Morris (Pan Farm), H. Russell (Roslin), E. Huxham, J. Duke, H. D. Morris (Fairlee), G. H. Burt, T. Barnes, and H. Hookey, and Messrs. H. Prouten, G. H. Dunford, and T. P. Whiston (representing the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows, of which the deceased was an old and much respected member). The coffin was of polished elm, with inner shell, and bore the inscription: "George Perkins, died March 13<sup>th</sup>, 1913, aged 64 years." There were beautiful floral tokens ..... Messrs. H. and F. Damp were the undertakers.
