A Well Known Master Mariner.—We regret to announce the death of a well known and much esteemed master mariner in the person of Capt. Charles William Price, of 100 Hunnyhill, which took place last week at the age of 69 years after a painful illness, patiently borne. The deceased was well known by local tradespeople and at Newport Quay, where he was a familiar figure in command of the sailing vessel Daring and the motor vessel Wessex. He commanded the Daring for 26 years, and once sailed her across the Channel alone. He was a superb seaman, of a genial disposition, and made many friends, who sympathize with the family in their loss. During the Great War the deceased sailed his craft night and day through submarine and mine infested seas, and came through unscathed.

The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Monday. The mourners were Captains T. W. and J. M. Price (sons), Mr. and Mrs. Freeman (son-in-law and daughter), Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Gloyn-Ham (daughters), Mr. and Mrs. Lowthian, Mr. and Mrs. Morris, and Mr. and Mrs. O'Rourke (sons-in-law and daughters), Messrs. Thomas and Harry Price (brothers), Mrs. Morey (sister), and Mr. Fuller (cousin). The widow and a daughter were unavoidably absent through indisposition.
