RETIRED GROCER'S DEATH

The death occurred in St. Mary's Hospital on Sunday, after a long illness, of Mr. Edmund William Reginald Sherwood, aged 65, of 6 St John's Road, who was well known and much esteemed as the former proprietor of the grocery and provision merchants' business of Cave and Sherwood, at 40 Nodehill. He carried on the business from 1922 until his health failed four years ago, and recently disposed of it. During the first world war he was a motor-cycle dispatch rider in Mesopotamia and India. Mr. Sherwood was a member of the I.W. Grocers' Association and a founder member of the I.W. Amateur Cine Society. He took a keen interest in amateur theatricals, but his chief relaxation, until his health failed, was walking. He and his wife regularly walked long distances in the country on Thursday afternoons and at week-ends. Their only daughter, Miss Margaret Sherwood, L.T.C.L., is well known as a pianist and member of the I.W. Opera Company. Cremation took place at Southampton on Thursday. At Mr. Sherwood's request, there were no floral tributes.
