Well Known Mariner's Death.---A well known figure on the Quay has been removed by the sudden death after a short illness, on Monday, of Mr. John James Arthur Snow, of 28 Orchard-street. Mr. Snow, who was 75, had been for many years master of vessels trading from the Quay to destinations all along the South Coast. He was a native of the town and was for over 40 years in the employ of Capt. W. Leigh, and later master of one of Messrs. W. B. Mew, Langton, and Company's vessels for 15 years. He was for a short time in the Company's store before retiring. He was one of the oldest members of the St. John's Men's Bible Class, and was formerly a member of the old St. Thomas's Bible Class, and had been a Forester for many years. The funeral took place yesterday (Friday), the interment at Carisbrooke Cemetery being preceded by a service in the Parish Church. The Rev. G. W. Dominey officiated. The mourners were Mesdames A. W. Brett, V. N. Bellman, and W. Richards, and Miss E. Snow (daughters), Mrs. W. Willis (sister), Mr. D. Snow (brother), and Messrs. Bellman and Richards (sons-in-law). Those also attending included Mr. W. Matthews and the following employees of Messrs. Mew, Langton, and Company : Messrs. R. Peachy, W. Wareham, D. Bundy, S. Foley, and W. Bennett. There were 23 floral tributes, including one from the directors of Messrs. Mew, Langton, and Company. Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
