Death of Miss Snudden. — The death of Miss Fanny Snudden, aged 75, which occurred rather suddenly at her residence, Avalon, Shide-cross, on Saturday, removes a lady who was well known and greatly esteemed. She was the youngest and only surviving daughter of the late Mr. James Snudden, who will be remembered as a local preacher and as the secretary of the district and local Court of the Foresters. The deceased lady was for many years engaged in business in Cowes. As a Life-long member of the Newport Congregational Church she had rendered loyal and devoted service, being especially prominent in work on behalf of the P.T.E. She was a very hard worker for that organisation, and by her charming affable manner attracted many to the cause. The funeral took place on Wednesday, the first part of the service being conducted at the Congregational Church by the Rev. D. Hendy Davies. The interment followed at Carisbrooke. Mr. J. H. Flux (organist) Played “O rest in the Lord” and “Then shall the righteous shine” (“Elijah”). The mourners were Mr. James Barton (nephew), Mr. E. Harding, Mr. and Mrs. F. Midlane, and Mr. and Mrs. W. Upward. Among the large attendance of the members of the church, the P.T.E., and P.S.A., There were also present the Rev. W. H. Mackinnon, Mrs. D. Hendy Davies, Mrs. W. Westmore, Miss French, and Messrs. J. Dufton, A. G. Harrison, and H. Porter.
