**Death of Mr. W. Solloway.**- Many who enjoyed his cheerful companionship and entertainment on the stage will regret to hear of the death on Thursday at his residence, Valetta, Castle-road, of Mr. William Thomas Solloway, well known as a singer of humorous songs and as compere of the Soldier's Recreation-room concert party and other parties of entertainers. Mr. Solloway had been prominent in this way since the last war in which he served with the Royal Warwickshire Regiment and was wounded, losing an eye. He was also a popular member of Messrs. H. W. Morey and Son's staff. Early this year he underwent a serious operation and, although for a while his health improved, it failed again. He was 56 years of age and leaves a widow and three daughters with whom much sympathy is felt.

Solloway.- The funeral of Mr. William Solloway, of Valetta, Castle-road, late of the Royal Warwickshire Regiment, well known as an entertainer, whose death at the age of 56 we recorded last week, was on Monday. A service was held in St. John's Church, at which the Vicar (the Rev. W. H. Mackinnon) officiated, and the interment was in Carisbrooke Cemetery where the Vicar of Carisbrooke (the Rev. H.
