Death of Mr. R. A. Stark, of Newport.

WELL KNOWN DAIRYMAN AND DEALER.

His many friends in the Island agricultural and sporting communities much regret the unexpected death of Mr. Roscoe Andrew ("Ross") Stark, of Watergate Farm, Newport, which took place at a Ryde nursing home on Wednesday.

Mr. Stark, who was 63, was taken ill at his home on Saturday. The trouble was later diagnosed as appendicitis, and he was removed to the nursing home on Tuesday for an operation, but, unfortunately, this proved too late, and he succumbed to peritonitis. He had spent the greater part of his life at Watergate Farm, succeeding his father, the late Mr. Andrew Stark, in the tenancy. As a dairy farmer, dealer in sheep and cattle, and one keenly interested in all outdoor sports, he was very well known, while his unfailing good humour and sportsmanship made him very popular with all his acquaintances. He had carried on an extensive dealing business, particularly in sheep, visiting mainland markets, was a regular attendant at Newport Market, and had occasionally exhibited pigs or sheep at the Island agricultural shows and at the Newport Gilten Markets. He was a member of the I.W. County Coursing Club, being an active follower of the sport in pre-war days, and was a vice-president and a former president of the I.W. Guernsey Cattle Society. His wife died about eight years ago, and there are no children. The funeral will take place to-day (Saturday), service at St. John's Church, Newport, at 2 p.m.
