Death of Mr. H. W. Taylor. – A respected resident has been removed by the death on Sunday of Mr. Henry William Taylor, of 1 Alberta-cottages, Gunville-road. Mr. Taylor, who was in his 80th year, had been employed at the Cement Mills for about 39 years, but retired some nine years ago. He had spent the whole of his life in the village, and sincere sympathy is felt with the widow and family in their loss. At one time the deceased was the big drum player in the village fife and drum band. The funeral was on Thursday, the service in the Parish Church being conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. H. Ewbank). The mourners were Messrs. C. and H. Taylor (sons), Mesdames Hibberd, Reynolds, and Gilbert, and Miss A. Taylor (daughters), and Messrs. P. Reynolds and B. Gilbert (sons-in-law), G. Wavell, and E. Taylor. The widow and Mr. F. Taylor (brother) were unable to attend. The interment was at the cemetery. ... Messrs. H. and F. Damp, of Newport, were the undertakers.
