The Late Mr. J. H. Taylor .- The funeral of Mr. James Henry Taylor, aged 70, of The Valleys, Little Whitcombe, who died at the County Hospital took place on Friday week. The service at the Parish Church was conducted by the Rector (the Rev. J. W. F. Wayet). Mr. Taylor, who was a South Africa War Veteran, had served with the 13th Hussars, and was at the relief of Ladysmith. He was a gardener at St. Dominic's Priory, Carisbrooke, until recalled to the Colours in 1914, and then served with the 11th Hussars on the Western Front, being severely wounded at Ypres. He was awarded the Military Medal. The mourners were Mrs. Taylor (widow), Messrs. J. & P. Taylor (sons), Mrs. M. Williams (daughter), Mesdames K. and D. Taylor (daughters-in-law), Mr. J. Long, C.C. (brother-in-law), and Mr. and Mrs. W. Barton (brother and sister-in-law). Others present included the Rev. Mother and representatives of St. Dominic's Priory, Mrs. W. Morris and Messrs. W. Ferguson, E. Capelhorne (representing the S.A. Wars Veterans' Association), E. F. Millgate (hon. secretary, representing the Newport and Carisbrooke branch of the British Legion), and Messrs. P. Dunn, W. Urry, C. Taylor (also representing Mr. Eli Taylor). A. Cooper, W. Morris, W. Cheek, and F. J. Sibbick. The arrangements were made by Mr. A. A. Westmore.
