ALMOST A CENTENARIAN. – The death took place on Thursday at St. Elmo, Watergate-road, the residence of Mr. and Mrs. J. Sanders, of Mr. William Turner, who was almost a centenarian, having celebrated his 99th birthday on June 30th. His early years were spent at Cowes, but he will be chiefly remembered in his market gardening business at Roselea, Carisbrooke, where he continued till the death of his son, Mr. F. A. Turner, a former chairman of the Carisbrooke School Board. Although he had lived in retirement for some years he had been quite active, and retained his faculties to a remarkable degree until the last. His recollections were most entertaining and he showed great interest in following the news of the war. His end came quite peacefully. Mr. Turner helped to build St. John's Church, Newport, having then worked for the father of the late Mr. Francis Sheppard and he helped to carry the cross and bell to the top of the church. It is a coincidence that he should have ended his days at what was formerly St. John's Vicarage. He never travelled further than W?

There were many beautiful floral tributes. The coffin bore the inscription "William Turner, died August 9, 1917, in his 100th year." The funeral arrangements were carried out by Mr. W. H. Bullock.
