Octogenarian Resident's Death.---The death occurred on Tuesday, in her 89th year, of Mrs. Alice Ann Tyler, formerly the wife of Mr. Samuel Melhuish, the first foreman of the "County Press" news composing department, who died in 1902. Mrs. Melhuish later married Mr. Arthur Tyler, a Gosport saddler, and following his retirement they lived at Hunnyhill for some years until his death in 1935. Mrs. Tyler was a Brading woman and remained wonderfully active for her years, until shortly before her death, which took place at the residence of her fourth daughter (Mrs. H. Wise), at Muriel Cottage, Albany-road, where she had lived since the death of Mr. Tyler. Mr. E. W. Melhuish, who now occupies the position at the "County Press" formerly filled by his father, is her only surviving son, and she leaves five married daughters.
