NEWPORT

The Funeral—took place at St. John's, on Thursday, of Mr. William Winter Wadham, third son of the late Mr. Henry Wadham, formerly assistant overseer of Carisbrooke, who died on the previous Sunday at the age of 73. The deceased was a much-esteemed officer of H.M. Convict Prison for some 23 years, until 1892, when he retired on pension. He had since been living at Newport, and took an active interest in the work at St. John's Church, of which he had been a member and sidesman for over 20 years. In his younger days he was a tenor singer in the Northwood Church choir and a prominent player of the Rookwood Cricket Club in its palmy days.

The Rev. E. W. T. Greenshield officiated at the funeral and paid a touching tribute to the deceased's devotion to his duties in connection with St. John's, and mentioned that his was the first body to be brought into the church since the re-seating and renovation, an improvement in which deceased had taken a great interest, and which had made possible the convenient holding of funeral services there.

The chief mourners were Messrs. W. H., F. G., and A. C. Wadham (sons), Messrs. F. W. Wadham (grandson), Sidney C. Wadham, T.C., Percy and Stanley Wadham (nephews), and Mesdames W. H. Wadham, and F. G. Wadham (daughters-in-law). There were also in the church Mrs. C. H. Wadham, Mrs. S. C. Wadham, Mrs. Ackerman, Mrs. J. Burrow, Mrs. R. Stephens, Mr. James Eldridge, Mr. A. H. Dockrill, Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Wray; Messrs. J. B. Alderslade, Prov.C.S., George Morris, T. P. Whiston, P.G., P. E. Whiston, N. G. and George Hazard, G.M. of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows, of which deceased was a member; and Messrs. J. H. Greenfield, John Burrow, R. Stephens, and A. Newbery (old colleagues of the deceased at Parkhurst).

There were floral tributes from his sorrowing wife; Will and Soph; Fred and Lottie; Bert, Flo, and Babs; Fred and Dora (grandchildren); Clara and family; George, Charlie, and Annie; and Nurse Price. Mr. G. F. Quinton carried out the funeral arrangements.
