NEWPORT

Well Known Townsman's Sudden Death.- Sincere sympathy is extended to the widow and only son in the death which occurred with tragic suddenness on Wednesday morning of Mr. Stanley Edmund Henry White, of Sydney Cottage, 11 Hunnyhill, very well known in the town as an esteemed employee of Messrs. Edward Morris at Emor House for many years. Mr. White was preparing to leave for his work when he collapsed and died at about 7.30 a.m. The facts were reported to the Coroner, but a post mortem revealed that death was due to natural causes, and an inquest was unnecessary. Mr. White as a lad entered the employment of the late Mr. Edward Morris at Cowes, and, apart from service during the 1914-18 war, had been with the firm ever since. During that war he saw service in France with the Royal Marine Light Infantry and was taken prisoner in 1918. As the result of his war service he had not enjoyed good health. He was a member of the Newport and Carisbrooke branch of the British Legion and of the Newport Conservative Club. The funeral will take place to-day (Saturday), service at Carisbrooke Church at 2 p.m.

Funeral of Mr. Stanley White.- The funeral of Mr. Stanley Edmund Henry White, of 11 Hunnyhill, whose sudden death was recorded last week, took place on Saturday. The service at Carisbrooke Parish Church was conducted by the Rev. D. S. McKenzie (vicar), and Mr. G. R. Barrett, at the organ, accompanied the hymn "Jesu, Lover of my soul" and Psalm 23 was chanted. The mourners were Mrs. White (widow), Mr. S. White (son), Mr. E. H. White (brother, also representing his wife, who is ill), Mr. and Mrs. E. Morris (brother-in-law and sister), and Mr. C. White (nephew). Those also attending included Messrs. A. B. Shaw, M.B.E., T.C., county secretary, E. F. Millgate, branch secretary, and E. C. Pearson, M.S.M., T.C. (representing the Newport and Carisbrooke branch of the British Legion), J. White, L. Rivett, L. Blackman, G. P. Gale, J. Colley, H. Hill, and B. H. Knight (representing the staff of Emor House), F. Scovell, C. Pragnell, H. H. Gould, H. Morris, A. Baker, S. Smart, and H. Green, Mr. Miller (representing Messrs. Wellspring, Ltd.), Mr. and Mrs. H. Morris, Mr. E. Hurry (representing the Conservative Club), and Mrs. Hurray. The interment followed at Carisbrooke Cemetery. The coffin was draped with the Union Jack and the flag of the Newport Conservative Club was flown at half mast. The floral tributes included those from the directors and staff of Emor House; The Conservative Club; and the Newport and Carisbrooke branch of the British Legion. Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
