**DEATH OF MR. JAMES WHITE.** – The death of another old and much-respected inhabitant of Newport has to be chronicled. Mr. James White, who had been in declining health for some time, died on Friday last, at the age of 62. The deceased was well known throughout the Island. For a long number of years he was chief clerk in the office of the county magistrates' clerk at Newport, and the public had abundant opportunities of witnessing the assiduous and faithful manner in which his duties were discharged. He was registrar of births and deaths for the Newport district, and he had for many years held the appointment of assistant-overseer for the parish of St. Nicholas. Strict conscientiousness characterised his performance of every duty, and he won the sincere respect and regard of all who were brought into contact with him. The funeral of the deceased took place yesterday (Tuesday), at Carisbrooke Cemetery, and the followers included a number of members of the Masonic fraternity, the late Mr. White having been one of the oldest Freemasons in the Isle of Wight.
