The Late Miss K. Williams. – The funeral took place on Monday of Miss Kathleen Williams, aged 62, of 40 Chapel Street, who died the previous Thursday. Miss Williams was the youngest daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. J. Williams. She was a fitter and dressmaker to Messrs. F. Burton, of High Street, having been employed by them for 32 years. In earlier years she had been engaged as personal dressmaker to Mrs. Burton, at Green Door, High Street. Miss Williams was held in the highest esteem by her employers and the staff.

The service was taken by the Rev. W. J. Carter at the Unitarian Church, of which Miss Williams was a member, having been the organist for many years. She had also been on the church committee and had taken Sunday-school classes. The chief mourners were Miss A. Williams (sister), Mr. and Mrs. J. H. R. Williams (brother and sister-in-law), Mrs. A. Williams (sister-in-law), Mr. G. Adams (brother-in-law), Mr. G. Williams (nephew), Mr. and Mrs. W. Sheaf (nephew and niece), and Mr. and Mrs. F. Burton. Mr. A. Williams (brother), Mrs. E. Breaker (sister), and Mrs. D. Williams (sister-in-law) were unable to be present. Church members and the Women's League, the staff of Messrs. Burton, the Sunday-school, and the Barton Brotherhood were represented. Among the floral tributes were wreaths from members of the Barton Brotherhood, the staff of Messrs. Burton, neighbours and friends of Chapel, Union, and New Streets, and members of the Unitarian Church and Women's League.
