THE DEATH OF MR GEORGE WOOLGAR.- aged 55, which occurred at 10 Holyrood-street, after a long illness, on Tuesday, removes a member of a well-known and highly respected family. The deceased, who was a cousin of the late Mr. Tom Woolgar, a benefactor to the town, had carried on the business of a hairdresser for 40 years, but when he became seriously ill the shop had to be closed. He was a keen angler and skilful flute player. He was a member of the Newport Philharmonic Society and also of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows. The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Thursday, the service being conducted by the Rev. Canon Thompson. The mourners were Mrs. Woolgar (widow), Mr. McGahey (brother-in-law), and Mr. and Mrs. Corbin (brother-in-law and sister of the deceased). Representatives of the local hairdressing trade and other sympathising friends also attended. The wreaths included one from the I.W. Anglers' Society. - Mrs. Woolgar wished to thank all kind friends for their sympathy in her sad bereavement. The funeral arrangements were carried out by W. H. Bullock and Son.
