NEWPORT DOCTOR'S DEATH.

On Saturday evening the Deputy Coroner for the Isle of Wight (Mr. F. A. Joyce) held an inquest at Newport, on the body of Dr. George Arthur Barr, aged 48. Deceased had been a practitioner at Newport for some 15 years and was medical officer of the Isle of Wight Union and police surgeon for the district. He was found dead, sitting in the lavatory at the back of his surgery, and the medical evidence was that death was due to syncope. - The Jury returned a verdict that death was due to cardiac syncope, and with the Deputy Coroner expressed deep sympathy with the widow and family in their bereavement. Deceased leaves a widow and two children.
