Funeral of a Brewery Employee.- The funeral took place on Saturday at Carisbrooke Cemetery of Mr. Frederick Blow, of 25 Castle Road, whose death occurred on Wednesday week at the County Hospital at the age of 60. Mr. Blow had been employed at the Brewery for nearly 43 years. He served in the I.W. Rifles for nine years, attaining the rank of sergeant, and was a member of the I.W. Old Comrades' Association and the British Legion. He had been married for 42 years and brought up a family of five sons and two daughters. The sons all served in the late war, and one was killed on D Day. Sincere sympathy is felt with the family in their bereavement. The Rev. Fr. Rea officiated and employees of the Brewery acted as pall-bearers. The mourners were Mrs. Blow (widow), Messrs. F. and C. Blow (sons), Mesdames V. Arnett and P. Rule (daughters), Mr. F. Blow (brother), Mr. and Ms. F. Moylan (brother-in-law and sister-in-law), Mr. W. Chessell (brother-in-law), and Mrs. M. Blow (sister-in-law). The floral tributes included those from the directors of the Brewery; fellow employees at the Brewery; British Legion; I.W. Old Comrades' Association; and the Clarendon Club. Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements. - Mrs. Blow and family thank all friends and neighbours for expressions of sympathy and floral tributes.
